Study this summer virtually at the SFU Beedie School of Business – Canada's Engaged University! SFU Beedie is pleased to provide international students an online offering of the 2021 SFU Beedie International Summer Program, for those who want an international experience while studying at home.

Students will take two non-credit courses online, gaining insight into critical elements of Canadian business environments.

Weekly virtual corporate visits provide industry connections and an inside look at popular businesses based in Vancouver. There are many opportunities for students to experience Canadian and Vancouver culture through various events planned throughout the program.

BUS XX1: Introduction to Entrepreneurship and Innovation

Entrepreneurship & Innovation, features internationally-recognized curriculum. Students will build the collaborative and creative skills necessary to become effective innovators through hands-on application via interdisciplinary teamwork. Entrepreneurship and innovation of all types will be addressed including social, commercial, creative, sustainable and technological perspectives. Guest lectures will focus on sustainability in the Vancouver Film Industry, and the opportunities and challenges COVID-19 has created for Hollywood North.

BUS XX2- Business Communications

Business Communications is a subject area that is relevant across the globe, and is of special importance in the world which we currently live. Students will examine and review today's global economy through critical analysis of differing perspectives and further develop and improve their critical thinking and communication skills, as appropriate to the business environment.

Both courses will feature synchronous and asynchronous communication in an immersive and engaging online environment.





Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Ms. Emily Treen is a sessional instructor at SFU Beedie, where her research focuses on the interface between marketing strategy and entrepreneurship, as well as Entrepreneurial Mindset development in children and adolescents.
